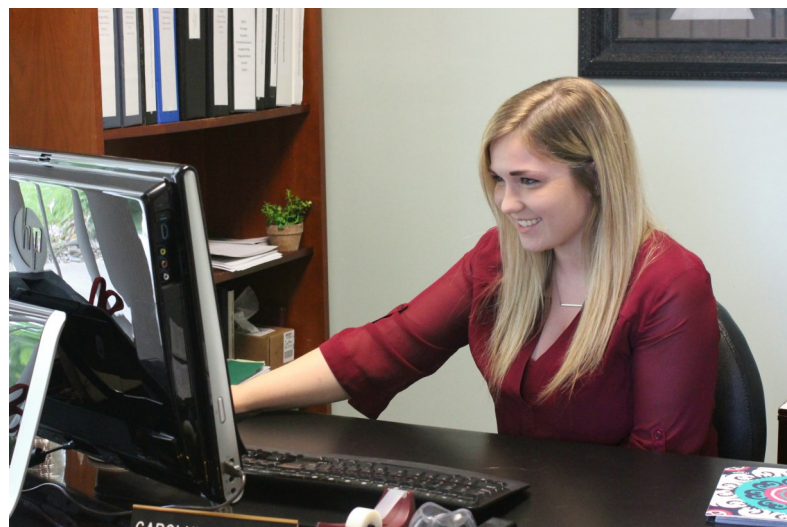

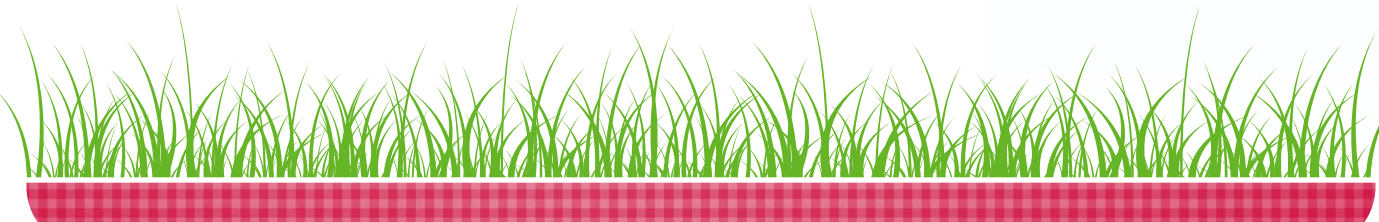
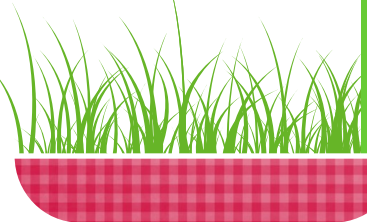


STAFF UPDATES...

Giving Circle Events

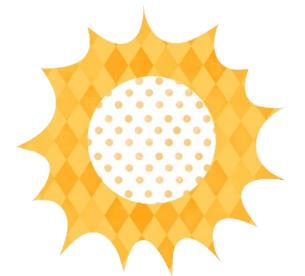
The Orange County Women’s Giving Circle is always busy, raising funds and creating program and projects that benefit uninsured and underinsured women throughout Orange County. In May, the group once again provided free mammograms through the assistance and generosity of IU Health Paoli Hospital and Southern Indiana Radiological Associates. Orange County women who may not have been able to afford this viable prognostic test received digital mammograms and professional reading of the results due to the hard work and commitment of the Women’s Giving Circle. In June, the Giving Circle hosted its fifth annual golf tournament, grossing more than \$7,300 in sponsorships, entry fees and gifts toward future programming and projects to benefit women’s health in Orange County.

Orange County Hometown Collaboration Initiative

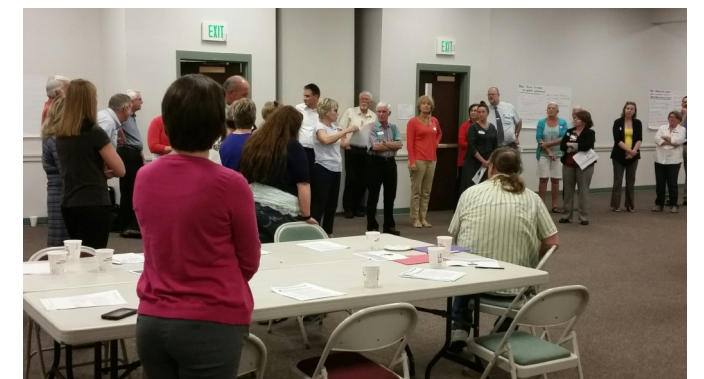
Orange County is home...and home is important. As part of its mission of “building a better community...together,” the Orange County Community Foundation applied for, and was granted, participation in OCRA’s Hometown Collaboration Initiative (HCI). As one of only five communities allowed to participate in 2016, Orange County’s HCI Committee planned and hosted a community forum on April 26, with more than 60 Orange County residents and workers, and those interested in the economic well-being of Orange County attending.

The HCI project included a community survey, as well, with more than 700 people responding to issues facing Orange County. This survey allowed the HCI committee and its coaches from OCRA, Purdue and Ball State Universities, to create a more complete picture of both the county’s assets and its problems. The survey results were utilized at the community forum to further expand on the information and to help compile a list of possible solutions to the difficulties the county is dealing with.

The last step in the HCI process, the “Capstone,” is a community project that will address one of three areas: Economy,

Leadership, or Place-Making.

Successive meetings will determine which of those areas the team will pursue, as well as establish a project—funded by both OCRA and OCCF—that will best address the need facing Orange County in that particular area.
