Building a Better Community...

Orange County Community Foundation, Inc. staff members Imojean Dedrick and Cathy Hardin recently attended Ball State University's Building Better Community class on Community Development at the Ball State Center in Indianapolis. The two-day class, facilitated by Dick Heupel of Building Better Communities, consisted primarily of the four phases of community development, which are 1) Where are we now?, 2) Where do we want to go?, 3) How are we going to get there?, and 4) What do we do next?

Heupel, along with fellow mentors Elizabeth Neu and Thayer Richey, led individual groups of students through the elements of each phase of community development, with each group creating its own community and developing that community through the four stages. Several learning stations were included, as well, with such topics as community visioning, GIS, philanthropy and community development, using data sources, creative problem solving, and professional development. The two will next attend workshops on Brownfields projects as a continuance of their economic and community development training.

Only students who complete the prescribed application are eligible for scholarship awards; and applications must be filled out fully in order to provide the information necessary for the selection process.

All scholarship selection committees must submit their criteria and selection processes to Orange County Community Foundation, Inc. for approval prior to applications being provided to them for selection. In addition, members of the selection committee are subject to approval by the Foundation's board of directors. This procedure is aligned with the regulations regarding the awarding of scholarship grants as prescribed by the federal government under the provisions of the Pension Protection Act of 2006.



BICENTENNIAL PROJECTS

Your community foundation is dedicated to building better communities right here in Orange County! In commemoration of the state's bicentennial in 2016 and with grants from Smithville Charitable Foundation and Lilly Endowment, plans for two local bicentennial park projects are underway.

Paoli Bicentennial Park (pictured above), located at the corner of Main and Water Streets, was completed in 2014 and dedicated in May of 2015. The park features a large gazebo suitable for outdoor performances, as well as tables and chairs for picnicking and permanent and seasonal landscaping. Sidewalks provide easy access to the green-space, and the area offers a quiet, reflective place to meet with friends, host family gatherings, or to simply read a book—as it's less than a block from the Paoli Library!

Ground-breaking for Orleans' Bicentennial Sulphur Well Park, located on Vincennes Street, was held on June 19 as part of the town's own bicentennial celebration. That park, upon completion, will feature a walking path, benches, a playground, a shelter house, and a commemorative marker indicating the location of the public sulphur well that once made the park a popular gathering place.

Both the Town of Paoli and the Town of Orleans provided property for the parks, as well as much of the funding necessary for the parks' construction. Grants from Smithville Charitable Foundation made it possible for the Orange County Community Foundation to help with funding of the projects, as

did assistance from Lilly Endowment's current matching funds program.

In the Springs Valley area, plans are underway to develop land donated by the French Lick Resort into a hiking and biking area as a bicentennial gift to residents and visitors alike. The 68 acres of open country and forest has been named by the Indiana Bicentennial Commission a Bicentennial Nature Trust project.

A grant application prepared by the Foundation on behalf of the Town of Orleans recently resulted in a grant of \$26,500 being awarded for the construction of a permanent performance stage in the town's Congress Square Park.
